Quaid-e-Azam was one of the finest leaders of the sub-continent. He was born on 25th December, 1876 in Karachi. He offered the Muslims of the sub-continent a precedent leadership. His father, Jinnah Poonja was a great merchant of Karachi; who could have ever thought that the weakling son of Poonja is blessed with all the qualities of a great leader by Allah, and would be one day the founder of Pakistan.

Quaid-e-Azam attained his early education in Karachi and Bombay. Even in student life, he was painstaking in his studies. He strictly followed the rules of discipline and mannerism. He was also very punctual. As a result of those attributes, he was loved by his teachers and fellow students. He burnt the midnight oil, which pointed out that he would attain greatness in future.

His father's friend Fredrick Croft saw a great man in him. He advised his friend to send his son to England for higher studies. Accordingly, Jinnah left for England. He got admitted to Lincon's Inn where he attained the degree of Bar-at-Law. He used to deeply indulge himself in his studies and often read the lives of great men in his spare time.

Quaid-e-Azam returned to his country and had to get a job because his father's business was not running well. He started practicing in Karachi but could not do well. He went to Bombay and joined the Third Presidency Magistrate. He knew that he had potential to be a good leader and lawyer and tried his luck again. This time he was successful and became a famous lawyer.

He joined the Indian National Congress in 1906, but soon realized that Congress was an all Hindu league. Therefore, he left Congress and joined Muslim League in 1913. He essembled the Muslims and gave them a new glorious vision. He knew that never the twain shall meet.

Quaid was a matchless leader. Our leader had many great qualities as well. He was fearless and courageous. Everybody knew that he always meant what he said. This quality endeared him not only to his own people but also won the respect and admiration of his opponents.

When the Muslims of the sub-continent faced emancipation and separation, they turned their eyes and hopes towards Quaid. Jinnah came forward and broke the fetters of slavery

and freed the Muslims of the sub-continent from the dual enslavement of both the British rule and the Hindu majority. It was due to his convincing argument and unflinching and keen personality that the British could not keep sub-continent united.

Despite his falling health due to over working Quaid had an abundant wealth of will power. Quaid died of a serious disease "Tuberculosis" on 11th September, 1948. His death was great loss but his services to the nation will always remain in our hearts.
