(i) How did the child look by appearance?

Ans: The sick child was exceptionally attractive. She looked as strong as a heifer. She had magnificent golden hair in profusion. She looked like one of those picture children whose pictures are produced in the Sunday papers. She had been suffering from high fever since the last three days. Her face was flushed and she was breathing fast. She was constantly looking at the doctor's face without showing any sign of restlessness. She seemed to be calm and quiet.

(ii) Why did the parents keep the sick child in the kitchen?

Ans: The child was suffering from high fever. Her parents were trying to save her from extreme weather conditions. The weather was cold and it was not suitable for the sick child. Moreover, the condition of the girl was precarious as her face was red and she was breathing fast. She seemed to be calm and quiet from inside but her external condition was getting worst with every passing moment. So they had kept her in the kitchen where it was warm.

(iii) How did the doctor succeed in examining her throat?

Ans: It was not an easy task for the doctor to examine the throat of the sick child. He was not sure about her real disease but he took a trial shot of her throat-examination. She did not cooperate with him and tried to resist him by throwing her glasses away on the kitchen floor. He got furious and asked her father to catch hold of her wrists tightly. He grasped her head with his left hand and forced the heavy silver spoon back of her teeth till she opened her mouth. He saw both of her tonsils covered with membrane. In this way, he succeeded in her throat examination by using force.

(iv) Describe the feelings of the doctor in his struggle to diagnose the disease?

Ans: The doctor underwent different changes in his struggle to diagnose the disease of the sick child. At first, he was in the best of his professional manner. He talked to the sick child politely. When the girl did not cooperate with him and her mother used the word 'hurt', he got furious. Then he overpowered the girl and diagnosed the real disease of bad tonsils. He had to use force to come to the disease. His act of fury and use of power didn't suit him but he was bound to do so. The parents had paid him higher fee than other doctors. He seems to be justified otherwise it would have been fatal to the sick girl.

(v) Compare and contrast the conduct of a healthy child and a sick child.

Ans: Child is an innocent angel who is a center of attraction at every place. A healthy and smiling child's conduct is entirely different from a sick child. A healthy child smiles and gets the attraction of others. We play and love him and spend most of our free time in the company of their innocent activities. On the contrary, a sick child is not at ease due to his illness. He weeps and remains disturbed until he is fully recovered. His crying most of the time disturbs us.

(vi) Under what circumstances can the use of force be justified?

Ans: The use of force is not always appreciated as it is considered to be a destructive force. It hurts others and sometime they also come to retaliation. But leniency is not the solution of every matter under all circumstances. There are social evils that destroy social peace and mental satisfaction. These disruptions need to be coped with an iron hand. The use of force upon them is justified. Similarly, children must be taught politely. But being immature, they repeat same type of mistakes that may prove to be harmful for them. They also need to be taught by using force. It is also justified. But one thing is pertinent to keep in mind that dialogue must be our first priority before taking any final action.
